

OVERVIEW OF GME AND CAHC

Graduate Medical Education Office: This office is part of the School of Medicine at the University of Connecticut and is responsible for administering the activities that are common to all of the residency programs. When applicants are selected to join residency programs, the program director provides credential and salary support information to the Graduate Medical Education Office. When all submitted

The GME office is responsible for coordinating activities with the CAHC regarding employment issues. Additional activities include assisting international graduates in obtaining appropriate visas, keeping permanent training records on residents, providing the appropriate state agencies with a list of all residents employed, notifying hospitals and other healthcare institutions of the names of all residents, and supporting the individual departments in carrying out the responsibilities of conducting graduate medical education programs. The GME office is headed by the Dean for Academic Affairs and Education and is staffed by several administrative and support personnel.

Capital Area Health Consortium (CAHC or Consortium): The Consortium is the organization responsible for the administration of the salary and benefits for all of the residency training programs. As such, the Consortium is the official employer of all of the residents. The staff of the Consortium works closely with the members of the GME office to ensure that the working conditions for the residents are appropriate and that the pay and benefits are of the highest level and quality. The Consortium is also involved in the evaluation of the quality of the residency programs and is active in the development of promotional materials about the residency programs and the University.
