State of Connecticut Controlled Substance Registration

The State Department of Consumer Protection mandates that all residents and fellows (with or without a state Medical license) practicing in the State of Connecticut must be registered in order to prescribe any controlled substance to any patient. This is different than the Federal DEA number as this is a State regulation. The annual fee is \$10. As long as the resident/fellow is employed by the Capital Area Health Consortium, the Consortium will cover the annual registration fee.

All new incoming residents and fellows will submit their paperwork to the Consortium prior to beginning work and the Consortium. All registrations expire annually on February 28th. After the initial registration, all housestaff will be notified by the State of Connecticut when renewal is required. Residents are required to renew their annual registration. The Consortium will automatically reimburse the resident via their paycheck annually.

All physicians are required to notify the State of Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection License Services Division at 165 Capitol Ave., Hartford, CT 06106 within five (5) days of a change in address or department.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS REQUIREMENT COULD RESULT IN YOUR INABILITY TO PRESCRIBE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE MEDICATIONS AND MAY ALSO RESULT IN A FINE. The Capital Area Health Consortium and the UConn School of Medicine will not be responsible for any loss of privileges or fines as the result of the Resident/Fellows failure to comply with the above mandate.
